



The One Size Fits Most One Hour Hat

Materials:

Trendsetter Yarns Eclipse [74% wool, 26%PA; 40yd/36m per 50g/1.75 oz skein; 3sts=1" on #13 needle]; color: Red 705; 2 skeins (Other thick/thin yarn of same gauge can be substituted)
US Size 13 DPN's
or 2 sets US size 13 circular (2 circulars to knit small diameter method)
Yarn Needle
Scissors

Gauge: 12sts/12rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch (unblocked, approx...thick thin yarn can be difficult to gauge)

CO 60, place marker.

Join and begin working in the round.

Knit until piece measures 4.5"

Begin Decreases:

K8, K2T, repeat to marker (total of 6 times, 54 sts remain)

Work 2 rows even.

K 7, K2T, repeat to marker (total of 6 times, 48 sts remain)

Work 1 row even.

K6, K2T, repeat to marker (total of 6 times, 42 sts remain)

Work 1 row even.

K5, K2T repeat to marker (total of 6 times, 36 sts remain)

K4, K2T repeat to marker (total of 6 times, 30 sts remain)

K3, K2T repeat to marker (total of 6 times 24 sts remain)

Work 1 row even.

K2, K2T, repeat to marker (total of 6 times 18 sts remain)

Work 1 row even.

K2T, repeat to marker.

Cut end of yarn to about 12". Weave the end of the yarn through the remaining stitches. Pull end to tighten inside of the hat.

Weave in all ends.

Using remaining yarn and yarn needle, weave in and out of the hat about 1 inch from the bottom. Leave about 5 inches of yarn on each end you have woven through. Where the two ends meet, pull to tighten bottom of hat to the correct size. Either make a temporary tie that can be modified later, or tie and weave in ends.
